Narrative Description

The Emmanuel Schenach House occupies Lot 4 of Block 35 of the Original Town. It faces north on McLean Street (County Road 2 Boulevard) between Leroy and Wood Avenues, and an unpaved alley edges the east property line. The gable-roofed, two-story house rests on a concrete block foundation and the exterior is clad in metal siding. The roof is clad in composite shingles and there is a concrete block, end-wall chimney on the south elevation and a parged chimney on the roof ridge. The rectangular plan has a one-story, shed-roofed addition at the east elevation. The offset entry of the three-bay north elevation has a single-leaf door surmounted by a glazed transom. The entry is accessed by wood steps. Most replacement windows throughout contain double-hung, one over one sash. There is a gable-roofed two-car garage (1981, Goodhue Co. Assessor) at the south property line.

History

This house was built in 1865 by Emmanuel Schenach, a wagonmaker, with his brothers, Englebert, a baker, and Gottfried, a blacksmith. Gottfried Schenach's house would be built to the east in 1870 (GD-FLC-075). The brothers were natives of Tyrol, Austria. They were among the German and Austrian craftsmen and laborers recruited by Israel Garrard to build the houses needed for the Frontenac settlement (Wendland 2018:495-7). Emmanuel and Anastasia's son, John Schenach, occupied the house 1909-1945, and it was next owned by Ray Carlson 1945-1980 (Wendland 2018a:503).

Early Vernacular style

A simple gable-roofed house, usually with a one- and one-half story block and a one-story wing or ell, was typical of dwelling construction during the first decades of mid-19th-century settlement in southern Minnesota towns. Exterior ornamentation was minimal, with flat millwork trim at the windows and entry. Like their more stylish Greek Revival style counterparts, the designs were found in widely circulated carpenter's plan books. There are many varieties and adaptations of the style, and turned posts, brackets, or gable end trim could be added to the basic design.

Statement of Significance

The Emmanuel Schenach House is located within the Old Frontenac National Register of Historic Places Historic District boundary (Lutz 1973). It is contributing to the district under Criterion A for its association with the 19th-century development of the Frontenac townsite. It is typical of the small vernacular dwellings built in the first two decades of Frontenac's development, ca. 1858-1878. The simple exteriors typically had little ornamentation at the gable ends or porch. The first owners' and later occupants' occupations were typical of those of the community's early laborers and craftsmen. Although re-sided and with window and other alterations in recent years, it retains enough exterior integrity to convey its historic significance.
